 .Mac is a set of online tools that are integrated with iLife and Mac OS X that allows you to simply integrate the internet with your Mac.
- How do I get it?
 You have to have a .Mac account. To get one, go to http://www.mac.com. There is a 60 day free trial or you can buy a year's access for \$99.




Go to System Preferences/. Mac and hit the

sync tab




Select what you want to sync and hit sync!



Sync duplicates

 Sync will walk you through any conflicts you need to resolve.




You are all synced!

 Now just sync your other Macs one-by-one and anything you have told .Mac to sync will be synced.

Beyond the sync

- You can either sync manually, or have it happen automatically, every hour, every day, or every week
- Add the status feature to your finder menu bar for easy access throughout the day.



Beyond the sync

 Sync is the best way to set-up email accounts, just set them up on one machine and you are all set.

Getting the most out of iDisk




iDisk: What is it?

- iDisk is an online storage space allowing you to store files on an internet hard drive.
- You can store, access, and share files in numerous ways.
- Mac comes with I0GB of storage, which you can update to as much as 30GB (for more \$).
- It behaves just like a hard drive, accept that all files are stored on Apple servers.


iDisk: How to get to it

 Once you are signed up just go to the finder and click on the idisk icon.



iDisk: The easiest way to share files

- Plunk them in your Public Folder
- It is great for files that are too large to email.



iDisk: How other users can get to your files

- You will need to provide your .Mac username, and your password (if you set one)
- On a Mac, go to the Go Menu>iDisk>Other Users
 Public Folder
- On a PC, download the iDisc Utility for Windows
- Or, provide them with the url to your iDisk, where they can download and upload files through a web browser interface.


iDisk: Sharing files

 Also, users can send files to you this way, instead of having to have you.


iDisk Syncing

• iDisk Syncing is a great way to work, it allows you to use your iDisk as a network volume that is constantly updated on whichever machine you are using.
